Incorporated April 24, 1882, the fire company has provided fire and rescue service to the community for over 125 years. Located near the corner of Main and Hall Streets in Spring City Borough, the company currently uses three pieces of fire apparatuses along with one fire police vehicle and a rescue boat.
